Memorial University launches Canada's first master's degree in social enterprise and entrepreneurship.



A new master's degree at Memorial University aims to train a different kind of business leader for a new way of doing business.

The master of business administration in social enterprise and entrepreneurship (MBA-SEE), launched by Memorial's Faculty of Business Administration, is a 12-month program focused on developing change agents committed to sustainable and social business practices in public, private and not-for-profit sectors.

"There is a growing awareness of social enterprise and social entrepreneurship throughout the business world," says Dr. Isabelle Dostaler, dean, Faculty of Business Administration. "With this new MBA program specifically designed to focus on the three pillars of sustainability – people, planet and profits – we aim to develop graduates who will be agents of change. The MBA-SEE puts Memorial on the leading edge of an important emerging sector of the provincial and national economy, one which has the potential to help navigate the current challenges that have arisen in business, culture, the environment and the economy."

The first cohort of MBA-SEE students will begin classes in fall 2018. Applications are now being accepted.
