Master's students must choose an eligible payment plan when accepting an offer of admission. Please note that normally the payment plan can only be changed in the student's first semester. Plan C is available to full-time students in certain programs only listed below.

The following are the only programs for which full-time Master's students are eligible to choose Plan C:

- Master of Applied Literary Arts
- Master of Applied Statistics
- Master of Arts, non-thesis route, in Anthropology (Social/Cultural), Economics, English Language and Literature, Environmental Policy, Political Science, Religious Studies and Sociology

- Master of Arts (Philosophy)
- Master of Business Administration (Social Enterprise and Entrepreneurship)

- Master of Education (Educational Technology) for students receiving advanced standing for UCCB certificate in education - technology

- Master of Occupational Health and Safety
- Master of Public Health (Population and Public Health)
- Master of Science, non-thesis route, in Mathematics
- Master of Science in Applied Geomatics

Students must pay the full program fee. If any program is completed in fewer semesters than the number of semesters listed above, a payment of an amount equal to the remaining number of semesters is required (e.g., if 9 semesters are to be paid and the program is completed in 7, the 2 remaining semester fees must be paid).

Continuance Fees: Students who do not complete their programs in the number of semesters listed above will be required to pay a continuance fee for each additional semester required as listed below.

Visiting Graduate Students

Distance Education [Administrative Fee](#)

The cost of program courses is included in the program fee. However, there is a charge for distance courses and certain special delivery courses for certain student cohorts. Consult the academic unit of interest to see if a fee is charged.

Recreation Fee (The Works)

All students are required to pay a recreation fee of \$62.98 each semester. (Students eligible for exemption must complete the exemption form .)	\$188.94 per year
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Student Services Fee

All graduate students are required to pay a Student Services Fee of \$50 each semester.	\$150.00 per year
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Campus Renewal Fee

All graduate students are required to pay a Campus Renewal Fee of \$166.67 each semester, this excludes graduate students on continuance.	\$500.00 per year
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Dental Coverage (All full-time students)

The rate payable in each of the Fall, Winter and Spring semesters is \$88.56 (Students who already have coverage must complete an Opt Out form .)	\$265.68 per year
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Drug and Health Insurance (All full-time students)

The rate payable in each of the Fall, Winter and Spring semesters is \$141.48 (Students who already have coverage must complete an Opt Out form .)	\$424.44 per year
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International Health Insurance and Medical Care Plan (MCP) (international students)

International students are advised to contact the [Internationalization Office](#) for current rates for international health insurance. International students with a study permit valid for 12 months or longer must apply for the [Newfoundland and Labrador Medical Care Plan](#).

Books and Stationery Supplies

The cost of books averages \$100 per course; the number of courses required varies from program to program. In addition, students may have further miscellaneous expenses in relation to course work and research.

For example, cutlery, linen, winter clothing for students from warmer climates \$650-\$1,250 per year
