Here's how to find a room. If it is H-1M200:

If The Fire Alarm Sounds

Emergency response occurs in two stages:

- During stage one**, an alert signal at 20 tones per minute prompts you to get ready. Stop all work, remain calm, check the immediate area and listen for announcements. Ensure all windows and doors are closed, prepare to evacuate and wait for the stage two alerts.
- During stage two**, an alert signal at 120 tones per minute prompts you to evacuate immediately. Evacuate using the safest exit and proceed outside clear of the building to a minimum distance of 100 m (300 feet) at the designated assembly point (**parking lot 9**).

During an evacuation, you are expected to comply with all instructions and orders from the Deputy Fire Wardens, Campus Enforcement and Patrol and the Fire Department.

- If you require assistance to evacuate:
 - Take shelter in a safe location,
 - Inform someone of your location, and
 - Ask them to notify CEP or the Fire Department of your location.

If You Discover Fire, See Smoke Or Smell Gas

- Sound the alarm to warn occupants: Fire Alarm Pull Station - this activates Stage I alarm.
- Evacuate immediately and proceed outside clear of the building to a minimum distance of 100 m (300 feet) at the nearest assembly point; (**parking lot 9**). **DO NOT USE ELEVATORS FOR EVACUATION PURPOSES.**
- If you require assistance to evacuate:
 - Take shelter in a safe location,
 - Inform someone of your location, and
 - Ask them to notify CEP or the Fire Department of your location.
- If trained to do so fight the fire only if it is small and not between you and an exit.
- Call 864-4100 Campus Enforcement and Patrol.
