

MASTER OF MANAGEMENT

The Grenfell Campus Master of Management (MMGT) program is the first and only program of its kind in Atlantic Canada, and one of only a few available in Canada.

This innovative, online, course-based program allows students to explore fundamental management topics as they relate to individuals, groups and organizations. Each cohort of students will complete the program in less than two and a half years.

The Grenfell MMGT is aimed at professionals with diverse backgrounds who are either currently employed as, or aspiring to become, managers in a broad range of organizations. Admission is limited and competitive, and is primarily intended for those who have not previously studied business or management in a post-secondary environment but who are working in or toward managerial positions and require the skillset that goes along with these. Applicants who have completed an undergraduate degree in business, commerce, management, or similar may also be considered for admission.

Courses and Program Requirements

The MMGT program comprises ten courses, to be completed online in a pre-determined sequence. Courses will normally be completed two at a time in the order outlined below. In addition, students are required to participate in an orientation workshop in August before beginning the study period.

Qualifications for Admissions

Hold a Bachelor's degree, with a GPA of at least 2.75, from an institution recognized by Senate and normally have at least two years of relevant full-time work experience, deemed acceptable by the selection committee.

How to Apply

The following documents must be submitted in support of the official application form:

1. letters of appraisal from two referees, at least one of whom has had close professional contact with the applicant within the last two years, and at least one of whom is capable of appraising the applicant's academic potential as a graduate student;
2. official transcripts from each university or other post-secondary institution previously attended (other than Memorial University), to be sent directly by its Registrar (or equivalent) to the School of Graduate Studies. If not recorded on the transcript, official evidence of completion of the undergraduate degree must also be submitted.
3. a current curriculum vitae detailing professional experience; and
4. a personal statement, of no more than 1,000 words, expressing why the applicant intends to pursue the MMGT qualification from Grenfell Campus and how the applicant is suitable for success in the program.

Frequently Asked MGMT Questions

Would I select fulltime or part-time on the application?

Although you only take 2 courses per semester, the Grenfell Master of Management program is considered a full-time program.

Do I need a Graduate Management Aptitude Test (GMAT) score to apply for the program?

A GMAT score is not required for this program.

How is this program delivered?

The Master of Management Program is a fully **online, course-based program**. No part of this program is delivered in person. The program does not include a thesis.

When do I register for my courses?

Once you have been accepted to the University and the program, you will be able to access MUN Self Service, which will provide your individual registration date and time in the weeks leading up to the registration period each semester.

You do not need to register for your courses at that precise date/time, but it is good practice to register as early as possible after you are eligible to do so. Program courses are completed in a pre-determined sequential order, beginning with 6001 and ending with 6010, so in your first term, you enroll in MGMT 6001 and MGMT 6002, and so on.
