

Teaching Term Position in English Literature (Dramatic Literature) GC-2025-003

Grenfell Campus, Memorial University of Newfoundland, is situated in traditional Mi'kmaw territory in Corner Brook, NL. The English Program, School of Arts and Social Science, invites applications for a 9-month teaching term position in English Literature at the rank of Lecturer or Teaching Assistant Professor, depending on the qualifications. This position will begin on 1 August 2025 and end on 30 April 2026.

The successful candidate will have at least an MA (PhD preferred) in English Literature and will be responsible for teaching first-year English courses (ENGL 1000 and 1001) focusing on the essay, fiction, poetry, drama, and composition. The successful candidate will also teach courses on dramatic literature such as ENGL 2350 (Introduction to Drama I) or 2351 (Introduction to Drama II) and a course or courses in their areas of expertise. These areas could be – but are not limited to – Indigenous drama, Restoration and eighteenth-century drama, Elizabethan-Jacobean drama, Modern drama, Irish drama, or contemporary British drama. Experience teaching at the university level will be considered an asset. The English Program promotes equity, diversity, and inclusivity in pedagogy.

Applications will be accepted until 5:00 pm (NDT) on Friday, 15 April 2025.
