Course Description: ENSU 2200 (Outdoor Pursuits - Fall) introduces the theoretical rationale and practical skills needed to demonstrate basic proficiency in several of the following activities: minimal-impact camping, wilderness cooking, hiking, kayaking, canoeing, navigating with map and compass, outdoor safety, search and rescue, and group management. The major focus of this course will be the practical application of learned skills. No prerequisites are listed for this course.

Qualifications: Masters/PhD in Environmental Studies, or related field is preferred.
