The School of Science and the Environment (Grenfell Campus) invites applications from individuals interested in co-teaching the following graduate course, as listed below, required for the Fall 2026 semester.

Subject to budgetary restrictions and sufficient enrolments, appointments will be made on a course-by-course basis and will not entail any obligation to conduct research or to perform any administrative service for Memorial University. Appointments will be made in accordance with the provisions in the MUN-LUMUN Collective Agreement. Course design and evaluation methods for all courses will be in accordance with the School of Science and the Environment's regulations and the Memorial University Calendar.

Course Title: ENVP 6528 (Mi'kmaw Perspectives on Sustainability – Fall)

Course Schedule: Tentatively scheduled for Tuesdays 13:30-16:20pm

Campus Location: Grenfell Campus, Corner Brook, NL

Course Description: ENVP 6528 (Mi'kmaw Perspectives on Sustainability) explores various dimensions of sustainability from a Mi'kmaw lens. Facilitated by Mi'kmaw community-connected instructors with contributions from multiple Mi'kmaw Elders and knowledge holders, this course will engage students in community-oriented and land-based learning to deepen their understanding of Mi'kmaw communities, histories, and lived realities in Ktaqmkuk (Newfoundland) and to consider several themes of sustainability within this context, including Mi'kmaw science, governance, storytelling, health, threats to sustainability, community case studies, rights, responsibilities, and activism.

Please note, this course is available in person only and will include a three-day on-the-land experience in Ewipkek (Flat Bay). The syllabus and more information about the land-based learning will be shared with students at the end of August.
