---

- Get your Recreation Pass if you want to join the gym at AS269

---

- If applicable, register for the public Medical Care Plan (MCP) insurance that covers the costs of insured physician services and emergency services offered to Newfoundland and Labrador residents'.

## INTERNATIONAL OFFICE SERVICES

### GRENFELL ARRIVALS

Coming to Canada is a big step for many international students as there are many inquiries about what to do before coming to the country. The arrivals process allows international students to plan their trip according to their needs.

As part of Grenfell's arrivals program, valuable information is both sent out and collected through the arrivals form to ensure a positive transition from your home country to Canada. For any questions, email [gcinternational@mun.ca](mailto:gcinternational@mun.ca).

### GROCERY SHUTTLE

The free grocery shuttle runs every Sunday during the fall and winter semesters. The shuttle starts at the Flag Poles (Grenfell Campus) and runs to Murphy Square (Walmart and Dominion), and the Valley Mall (Sobeys).

The grocery shuttle during the spring semester runs every other second Sunday.

### HEALTH INSURANCE

All international students are automatically enrolled in our foreign Health insurance **Guard.Me**. Your Guard.Me policy number and healthcare card will be sent to your MUN email within the first 20 days of the semester. It is important to have your healthcare card with you as you will need it in case of an emergency or to get any prescriptions. Otherwise, you will be expected to pay for any emergency medical services. If you do not have this number, you can download it at [guard.me/mun/myaccount](http://guard.me/mun/myaccount). Use your MUN email to log in or you can scan the code to download your healthcare card, check



your policy plan, and add dependents. If you cannot get your healthcare card or have questions, please email [nclark@mun.ca](mailto:nclark@mun.ca).



### MULTIFAITH SPACE

Our Multi-faith Space is located in AS273 in the Arts and Science building. It is open to all students every day of the week. You can book the space by contacting the International Office.

### MCP

The **Medical Care Plan** (MCP) is the provincial health insurance free to residents of Newfoundland and Labrador, including your family and dependants. With MCP, you can see a doctor on Campus, find a family doctor, or go to a walk-in clinic.



### To apply you need to:

- Be a full-time student
  - Have a study permit valid for at least one year
  - Have a copy of your passport
  - MCP application form [www.gov.nl.ca/hcs/mcp/](http://www.gov.nl.ca/hcs/mcp/)
- You can bring or send a copy of your documents to the international office. We mail MCP applications on Friday mornings.

**IMMIGRATION ADVISING**

**SOCIAL INSURANCE NUMBER CLINICS**

Service Canada offers an in-person tax clinic during the first week of classes in the fall and winter semester. Check the **orientation schedule** to find out about the dates. You need to bring your passport and your study permit. If you are not able to come to the clinic, you can get your SIN online by visiting the Service Canada webpage. This process can take up to 10 business days. You can also visit the Service Canada building in Corner brook and get your SIN the same day.

**TAX SESSIONS AND TAX CLINICS**

During the winter semester, the international office offers multiple virtual and in-person tax information sessions. The Business faculty offers an on-campus tax clinic. Keep an eye on your email, Brightspace, and social media to find out when these sessions will take place.

**INFORMATION SESSIONS AND SOCIAL EVENTS**

The international office hosts different sessions and events during the semester. These include tax sessions, SIN clinics, banking support, school trips, and social gatherings. 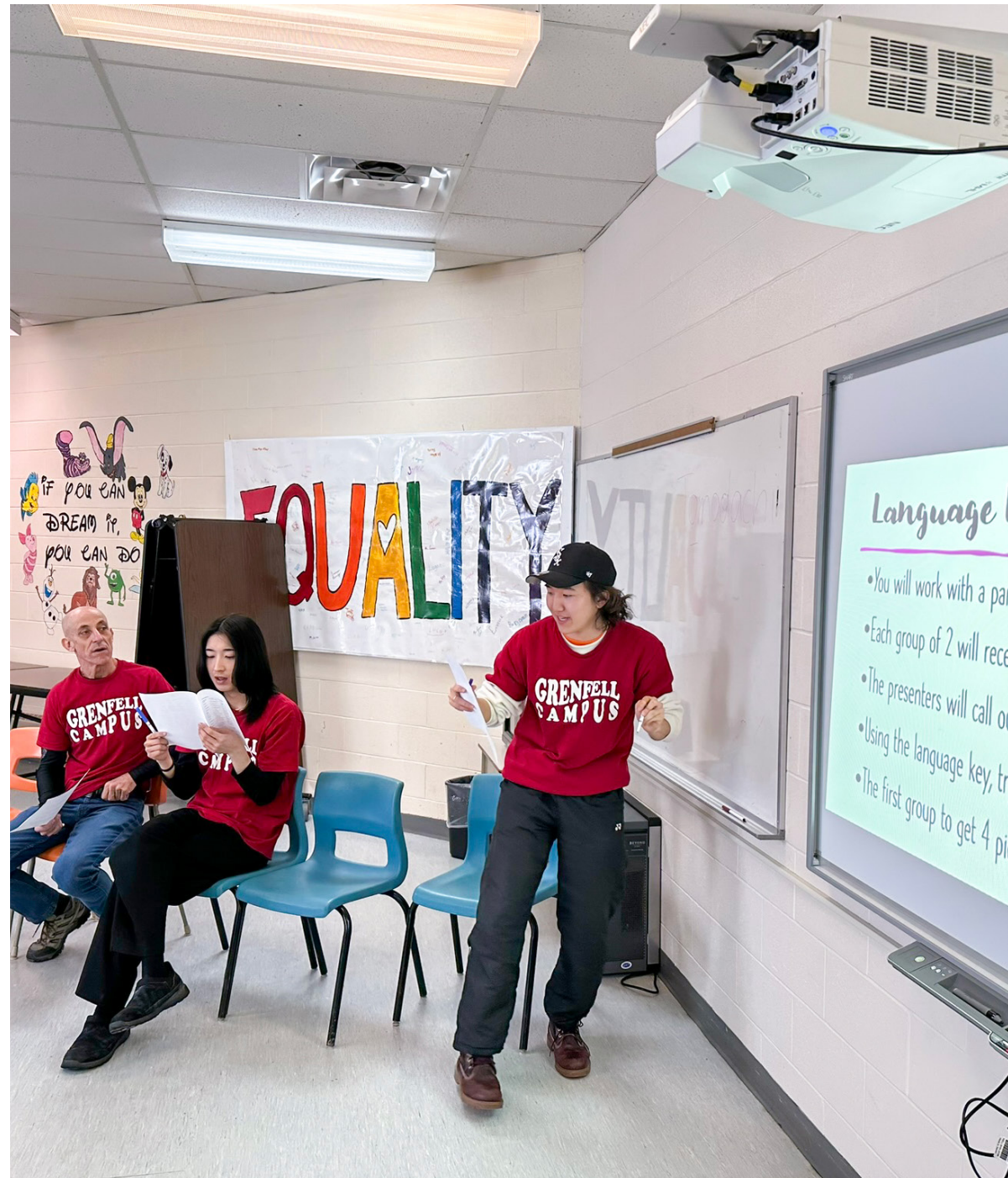
**QUESTIONS ABOUT LIVING IN NEWFOUNDLAND?**

### CULTURE TO COMMUNITY C2C

Culture-to-Community (C2C) program is aimed at promoting cultural awareness, sensitivity and respect for all individuals in western Newfoundland and Labrador through an equity, diversity, inclusion and anti-racism (EDIAR) lens. C2C links students in the kindergarten to grade 12 school system in Western Newfoundland with students at Grenfell Campus. These programs seek to bring different perspectives into schools in Western

Newfoundland and Labrador. All materials and transportation to the schools are provided by the International Office.

### THE GRENFELL BUDDY PROGRAM

Help new international students to transition to Grenfell Campus! The Grenfell Buddy Program lets you do that by pairing currently enrolled international students at Grenfell with new, incoming international students for the purpose of creating a social network for these students before they arrive in Canada.

Some of the ways that buddies can help new students is answer questions about a wide variety of topics including:

- Their experiences as an international student living in Corner Brook
- Where to go and who to talk to about campus and community resources
- How to get involved in campus life
- Cultural norms in Canada and what to expect

While a Buddy's main job is to be your main point of contact before new international students arrive, their role doesn't end there. Throughout your first semester, Buddies can also let you know about social activities, and information sessions that are relevant to all international students.

## USEFUL INFORMATION

- Sales Tax is common in Canada. The price tag is not the final price. There is a 15% tax on the price tag.

---

- If you are from a tropical country be prepared to face extreme winter.

---

- You need to contact a pharmacy if you need to get prescriptions. Show your healthcare card (guard.me or GSC) before you pay as prescriptions may be covered.

---

- Use the available resources such as student discounts, university resources and rewards or bonuses.

---

- Undergraduate students: maintain a minimum of three courses each semester to remain a full-time student.

---

- Ask an immigration advisor if you are eligible to work in Canada. If so, ask what documents you need!

---

- Don't buy a car as soon as you come to Canada as there are many expenses associated with it like your monthly payments, insurance, winter and summer tires, registration etc.

---

- Introduce yourself to your professor and departments on campus. During the school year, your professors and the staff on-campus are your best friends.

---

- If you wish to opt out of guard.me (your health insurance), and enroll in the student union health plan, visit [guardme/mun](https://guardme.mun.ca).

---

- Keep a track of the university calendar as well as your course due dates. One missed assignment could cost you the whole course.

---

- Feeling lonely and nostalgic is normal. Grenfell Campus provides counseling through CPS and Keep.me Safe.

---

- Always carry change. Public transit costs \$3.25 per ride. You can buy bus passes at the bookstore.

---

- Anyone who emails [ginternational@mun.ca](mailto:ginternational@mun.ca) before the add/drop date for the semester (as noted in the academic calendar) will be entered into a prize draw! Only new international students who started their studies this semester are eligible to enter. Your email must include your full name, student ID number, and at least one (1) piece of information from this guide that was useful to you and why. We will have 5 winners.

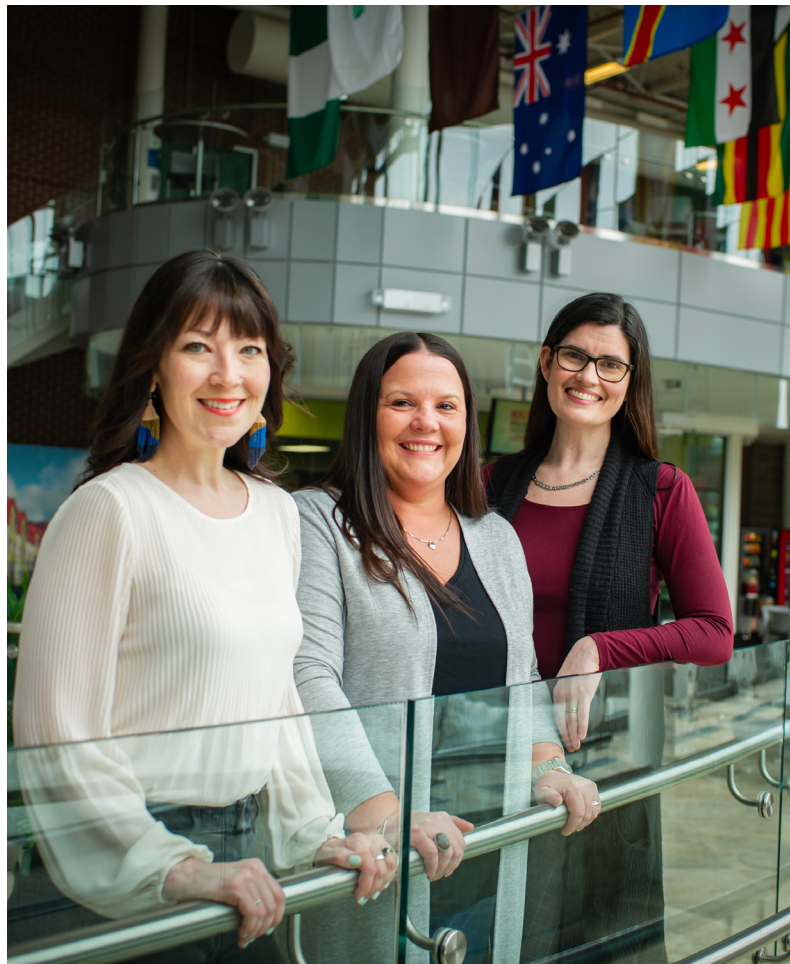

Grenfell undergraduate students who are enrolled in a Grenfell degree program have the opportunity to participate in an outbound exchange program if they wish. 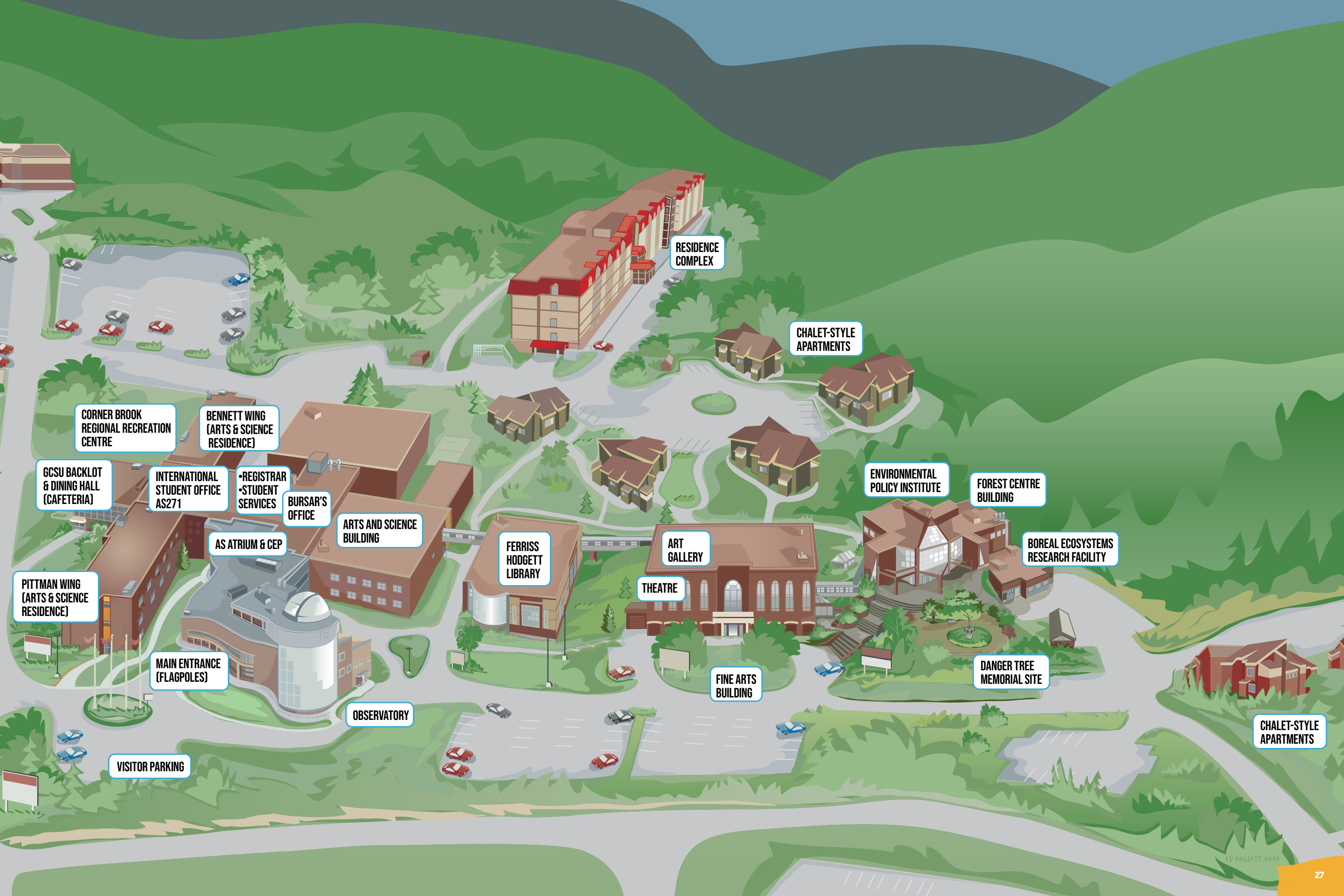
