

HSS-Nexus Centre Fall 2025 Interdisciplinary Graduate Course

Summary

The primary aim of the Nexus Centre's *Interdisciplinary Fall Graduate Course* (HUMN code) is to propel graduate collaboration and thinking in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences through an elective graduate course open to all HSS graduate students. HSS tenure-track and tenured faculty are encouraged to apply. The faculty member's department will receive a PCI contract to compensate.

Graduate students should apply for the course (through the Nexus Centre; student complement determined by instructor) in the first week of September with a short application indicating how the course relates to (1) their research goals and (2) their program, in coordination with their supervisor (if any). The course would require a minimum of five students to go ahead.

Benefits

- 1) One 60-hour GA-ship in the Spring/Summer to assist with the preparation of the course;
- 2) Use of the Nexus Centre to teach the course;
- 3) The possibility of adding the award, dissemination, and public engagement activities to one's CV.
