The School of Arctic and Subarctic Studies at the Labrador Campus of Memorial University invites applications from individuals interested in teaching the following **undergraduate course** in the **Bachelor of Arctic and Subarctic Interdisciplinary Studies (BASIS)** program in the **Fall 2024** semester.

Subject to budgetary restrictions and sufficient enrolments, appointments will be made on a course-by-course basis and will not entail any obligation to conduct research or to perform any administrative service for Memorial University. Appointments will be made in accordance with the provisions in the MUN-LUMUN Collective Agreement. Course design and evaluation methods for all courses will be in accordance with the School of Arctic and Subarctic Studies regulations and the Memorial University Calendar.

Course Title: SASS 1500: Fall Camp 1

Course Schedule: Fall 2024 Module 2 (second six weeks of the Fall semester) (days/times tbd in consultation with successful candidate and the Dean)

Campus Location: Labrador Campus of Memorial University, Happy Valley-Goose Bay, NL

Course Description: SASS 1500: Fall Land Camp 1 initiates students to the land, people, and waters of coastal Labrador. Participants will spend 48 hours on the land and waters of coastal Labrador with a host community, organization, or family. In this time students will work together to set up tents, procure food, water, and wood, prepare meals, and participate in coastal-based cultural activities and learning.

Qualifications: Candidates must have a minimum of a Master's degree with a proven record of instructing at the undergraduate and/or graduate level. Preference will be given to individuals from Labrador who have: a lived experience in organizing and leading land-based learning opportunities; hold an academic background in Labrador lands, waters, cultures, wildlife; have

experience with land-based pedagogies; and who conduct research in Labrador and have relationships and connections with Labrador partners.
