# Scholarships and Grants for Students from NL

#### 1. AFFINITY NL (OTTAWA) SCHOLARSHIP

Internal SASS Deadline: October 29
External Deadline: November 17

Amount: \$7,315 once

**Description:** Awarded alternately each year between a full-time undergraduate and graduate student. This scholarship will be awarded to an undergraduate student in the 2024-2025 scholarship year. The graduate student must be entering their first year of their master's or doctoral program in September, at the time of application.

**Eligibility:** The applicant must be from a rural community in Newfoundland and Labrador and express an interest in returning to work in rural Newfoundland. It is awarded based on scholarship standing. Rural is defined as outside St. John's and Corner Brook as determined by the Centre for Institutional Analysis and Planning, or an equivalent University or Government body.

#### 2. DAVID CURRAN AWARD IN REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Internal SASS Deadline: January 12

External Deadline: January 31

Amount: \$1,000

**Description:** This award was created in recognition of David Curran, a passionate advocate and tireless champion of rural Newfoundland and Labrador. It was established by the Harris Centre, the Newfoundland and Labrador Regional Economic Development Association, and Municipalities Newfoundland and Labrador to recognize Mr. Curran's impact on rural Newfoundland and Labrador, and to encourage that same spirit of community development innovation in undergraduate students at Memorial University of Newfoundland. The award will be granted annually to a student beyond first year enrolled in any program with a study focus in a field relating to regional development.

**Eligibility:** Any undergraduate student who: meets minimum academic requirements for an award as determined by the Senate; is in a program of study in some ways relating to regional development; and is beyond their first year of study.

#### 3. SAM STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

Internal SASS Deadline: April 11

External Deadline: May 1

Amount: \$1,000

**Description:** The SAM Environmental Stewardship Award is used to recognize an individual, group, organization or business who has gone above and beyond in their community to support wildlife habitat stewardship, whose responsible management of wildlife habitat and the environment within Newfoundland and Labrador exceeds expectations. First awarded in 2015, this scholarship is awarded to a student either from or studying in Newfoundland and Labrador whose interests, activities and post-secondary goals are focused on the conservation of habitat in this province.

**Eligibility:** Applicant must be a resident of or must be studying in the province of Newfoundland and Labrador; Is (or will be) enrolled in a post-secondary program in the upcoming academic year; Have demonstrated an active commitment to conservation in Newfoundland and Labrador.

#### 4. YOUTH FOSTER SUPPORT BURSARY

Internal SASS Deadline: May 12

External Deadline: June 1

Amount: Annual costs of tuition & required fees at entirety

for up to 4 years.

**Description:** The Youth Foster Support Bursary will be made available each year to individuals who have been in foster care in Newfoundland and Labrador and who wish to attend Memorial University of Newfoundland as full-time undergraduate students at any of the University's campuses. The bursary covers the annual costs of tuition and required fees in their entirety, renewable for up to three additional years, for a total of four (4) years of study (8 semesters).

**Eligibility:** To be eligible for this bursary, and annual renewal, students must have been in foster care in Newfoundland and Labrador for a minimum of 12 months; be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident and typically would be a resident of Newfoundland and Labrador; be working towards their first undergraduate credential as per the definition of undergraduate studies at Memorial for this initiative; demonstrate financial need; and, not be in receipt of funding/bursaries from other sources that cover tuition and required fees. An application is required and the deadline for submission is March 1 of each year. In instances where there are more eligible applicants than available funds, those with the greatest demonstrated financial need will be chosen to receive the bursary. For students attending the St. John's, Grenfell and Labrador Campuses, the bursary will be granted by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Scholarships, Bursaries and Awards.

#### 5. THE 2023 JOHNSON INC. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Currently closed for applications but will open with a new description and eligibility in Spring 2024.

**Description:** Since 1998, the Johnson Scholarship Program has awarded over \$1,000,000 in scholarships and academic grants to students across Canada. Please visit this website for scholarship program updates and to access the online application form and obtain full requirements and submission instructions.

**Eligibility:** Applicants must be: a resident of a province or territory of Canada; completing high school in 2023; and enrolled in an undergraduate program on a fulltime basis for the 2023-2024 academic year at a recognized publicly funded Canadian post-secondary institution or CEGEP (if living in the province of Quebec). Applicants must also fall into at least one of the following categories: have a home or car insurance policy through Johnson or MEDOC travel insurance policy or group benefits plan (such as health, dental or life insurance) through Johnson be a member or employee of a Johnson recognized group\* (policy not required); have a parent/guardian or grandparent who has a home or car insurance policy through Johnson or MEDOC travel insurance policy or group benefits plan (such as health, dental or life insurance) through Johnson; have a parent/guardian or grandparent who is a member or employee of a Johnson recognized group\* (policy not required); OR be a child/grandchild of a Johnson employee or a child/grandchild of an employee within the Direct Distribution division of IFC. Applications shall be submitted on the completion of the applicant's graduating year of high school. A completed application must include a transcript for the period of September 2021 - December 2022.

#### 6. TD SCHOLARSHIPS FOR COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP

Internal SASS Deadline: Mid-November

External Deadline: December

Amount: Up to \$70,000 over 4 years

**Description:** The TD Scholarships for Community Leadership are designed to recognize the achievements of youth who are making a difference and help them realize their educational goals. Twenty TD Scholarships for Community Leadership are awarded to students in their last year of high school or CEGEP (in Quebec) who have demonstrated leadership in improving their community. This opportunity is open to both Indigenous and non-Indigenous youth.

**Eligibility:** TD Scholarships for Community Leadership are open to students across Canada who: have demonstrated community leadership; are in the final year of high school (outside Quebec) or CEGEP (in Quebec); and have a minimum overall grade average of 75% (outside Quebec), or a minimum R score of 26 (in Quebec), in their most recently completed school year.

#### 7. DISC STUDENT INVOLVEMENT AWARD

Internal SASS Deadline: October 12

External Deadline: November 1

Amount: \$500

**Description:** This award was established by the MUN Disability Information Support Centre (DISC). Two awards will be granted annually to students who self-identify as having a disability. The recipients can be in any program and year of study at Memorial University of Newfoundland. Preference will go to students who are involved with student life, community volunteer work or maintain a high academic average.

**Eligibility:** The recipient must meet the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by the University. The award will be granted by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Scholarships, Bursaries and Awards. An application is required and is available at the <u>Scholarships and Awards Office website</u>.

#### 8. GLENN ROY BLUNDON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Internal SASS Deadline: October 12

External Deadline: November 1

Amount: \$500

**Description:** This scholarship was established by the family, friends and fellow students of the late Glenn Roy Blundon, a former student of Memorial University of Newfoundland who, despite his severe physical disability, succeeded in his studies and made a significant contribution to student life.

**Eligibility:** In the awarding of this scholarship, preference will be given to academically qualified students with disabilities but those enrolled in the Special Education Program may be considered when no candidates are available from the first group. An application is required which is available at the S<u>cholarships and Awards Office website</u>.

#### 9. OCEAN RANGER MEMORIAL AWARD

Internal SASS Deadline: January 5

External Deadline: January 19

Amount: \$500 per year

**Description:** On February 15, 1982, the Ocean Ranger Exploratory Drilling Platform sank, resulting in the tragic loss of the 84 crew members on board. As a memorial to this loss, an award program was established by the Ocean Ranger Disaster Fund. These awards, valued at \$500 per year, are tenable by students who are entering or pursuing a post-secondary programme of studies at Memorial University, the Fisheries and Marine Institute, and the College of the North Atlantic.

**Eligibility:** In selecting candidates, preference will be given to widows and lineal descendants (children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren etc.) of victims of the disaster. In the absence of eligible candidates from this group, the award may be given to other fulltime students at the discretion of the Ocean Ranger Award Selection Committee.

#### 10. HARRISON MCCAIN SCHOLARSHIP / BURSARY

Internal SASS Deadline: February 7 External Deadline: February 27 Amount: \$4,000 for 4 years

**Description:** The Harrison McCain Scholarships / Bursaries are available annually to entering students attending University who have graduated from a high school in Canada. Each award has a program value of \$16,000 payable over a four-year course of study in the amount of \$4,000 per year.

**Eligibility:** Criteria for the awards include a minimum 80% average in senior year of high school, financial need, leadership qualities, and a recognized initiative in funding your own education. The number of scholarships/bursaries available may vary from year to year. Renewal criteria to be met each year.

#### 11. DERMOTT O'REILLY LEGACY AWARD

Internal SASS Deadline: February 15

External Deadline: March 1

Amount: Varies

**Description:** The award, valued at a portion of the income on the investment, is established through funds raised by family, friends and music lovers, in Dermot O'Reilly's memory after his untimely passing in 2007. Dermot chose to make Newfoundland his home in 1971 where he found here a kinship to the Dublin of his youth in the people, music and songs. Here, his life was music. He delighted in sharing music with others and was a mentor to many aspiring musicians. Dermot's friends and family carry on his legacy by creating this award to encourage and support the promotion of traditional music, oral tradition and dance in Newfoundland and Labrador. It will be given annually to a part-time or full-time student at Memorial University enrolled in any year of any program of study that meets the academic requirements for an award as outlined by the University.

**Eligibility:** Based on established support of traditional music, oral tradition or dance amongst Newfoundlanders and Labradorians. The successful candidate will be determined at the discretion of the Dermot O'Reilly Legacy Award Selection Committee and will have made evident, either through actions or creative undertakings, contributions to the province by demonstrating leadership and creativity in the tradition-bearer community. To be considered, candidates must apply by *March 1, each year*. Applications are available at the Undergraduate Scholarships and Awards Office and must be accompanied by a resume of all relevant information including but not limited to: publications, research, recordings, projects, performances, etc.

#### 12. ACUNS STUDENT AWARDS PROGRAM

Internal SASS Deadline: Two business weeks prior to submission

External Deadline: Varies

Amount: Varies

**Description:** The Canadian Northern Studies Trust (CNST) is the awards program of the Association of Canadian Universities for Northern Studies (ACUNS). It was established in 1982 to further ACUNS' mandate to advance knowledge and understanding of Canada's North by offering student awards for exceptional, Northern-based research. The purpose of the CNST is to foster scholars and scientists with Northern experience and at the same time enhance educational opportunities available for Northern residents to obtain post-secondary education at Canadian colleges and universities

**Eligibility:** To be eligible for an ACUNS award you must be: Canadian citizen or permanent resident; Enrolled in full-time post-secondary education at a recognized Canadian University or College; Have an aspect of Northern or Circumpolar fieldwork included as part of your research that is conducted within the term of your award. (ACUNS defines "Northern" Canada as on or north of the line indicated on our *Northern Boundary Map*). Additional, award-specific requirements are included in award guidelines.

# Scholarships and Grants for Indigenous Students

#### 13. JORDAN'S PRINCIPLE SCHOLARSHIP

Internal SASS Deadline: April 12

External Deadline: April 30 Amount: \$2,500 - \$5,000

**Description:** In loving memory of Jordan River Anderson, the Jordan's Principle scholarship will be awarded to First Nations students studying children's holistic health and wellbeing.

**Eligibility:** Applicants are eligible if they are a First Nations student studying children's health or children's disabilities at a Canadian post-secondary institution; and demonstrate a commitment to Indigenous children's health and community service as well as academic commitment and achievement.

#### 14. 2023/24 KAUSATTUMI GRANTS PROGRAM - SCHOLARSHIPS

Internal SASS Deadline: May 1

External Deadline: May 19

Amount: \$7,500

**Description:** Scholarships are available for Indigenous undergraduate students who have completed at least two years of postsecondary study and are involved in community-informed and supported health research that serves to benefit Indigenous communities in Atlantic Canada. By community-informed and supported health research, we are referring to research that responds to a community-identified need and is supported by an Indigenous community, Nation, or organization. The funding is provided for a one-year period: September to August. The amount of the scholarship will be pro-rated in the case of part-time enrolment status and/ or expected date of completion for the current program of study. For example, a student enrolled in an Undergraduate program on a part-time basis will be eligible to receive a scholarship award of \$3,750.

**Eligibility:** First Nations, Métis, and Inuit undergraduate students who have completed at least two years of postsecondary study and are involved in community-informed and supported health research that serves to benefit Indigenous communities in Atlantic Canada, with the supervision of an Indigenous or allied health scholar at a post-secondary institution. First Nations, Métis, and Inuit undergraduate students are eligible if they are attending any Canadian post-secondary institution, as long as they haven't received funding from another Indigenous Mentorship Network in the same funding period. If a student is applying from outside of Atlantic Canada, they must demonstrate a connection to the region (e.g., they must be Indigenous to Atlantic Canada and/or they must demonstrate the impact that their research will have on the health of Indigenous communities in Atlantic Canada).

#### 15. JIM BOURQUE SCHOLARSHIP

Internal SASS Deadline: June 20

External Deadline: July 8

Amount: \$1,000

**Description:** This scholarship honours the legacy of the late Hon. James W. Bourque, PC. Born in Wandering River, Alberta, Bourque was of Cree and Métis background. At the age of 18 he was elected president of an association of hunters and trappers in Fort Chipewyan before working as a park warden in Wood Buffalo National Park from 1955 to 1963. He served as president of the Métis Association of the Northwest Territories from 1980 to 1982, was deputy minister of renewable resources for the government of the Northwest Territories from 1982 to 1991 and chairman of the Northwest Territories' Commission for Constitutional Development. In 1984 he founded the Fur Institute of Canada, serving as its chairman for four years. He was named co-director of policy for the Royal Commission on Aboriginal People in 1994. On July 1, 1992 he was sworn into the Queen's Privy Council for Canada.

**Eligibility:** Yo be eligible you must be enrolled in post-secondary training in Education, Environmental Studies, Traditional Knowledge or Telecommunications; and are a Canadian Indigenous student.

#### 16. BIRD HEAVY CIVIL LTD. INDIGENOUS SCHOLARSHIP

Internal SASS Deadline: June 27

External Deadline: July 15

Amount: \$1,500

**Description:** The Bird Heavy Civil Ltd. Indigenous Scholarship is an annual scholarship designed to encourage and support Indigenous people of Canada with their career development and growth as they attend post-secondary education.

**Eligibility:** Applications will be accepted from students who are currently enrolled in a full-time post-secondary institution or students in Grade 12 who are planning to attend a full-time post-secondary education institution that are of Indigenous descent (First Nations, Métis or Inuit). Students pursuing an education in the technology and trades will be considered priority applicants. Three scholarships per year may be awarded to applicants from the three Indigenous groups who are enrolled in a technical / trade program with a recognized post-secondary institution.

#### 17. HELEN BASSETT COMMEMORATIVE STUDENT AWARD

Internal SASS Deadline: June 27

External Deadline: July 15

Amount: \$1,000

**Description:** Every year, the Native Women's Association of Canada (NWAC) provides the Helen Bassett Commemorative Award to four Indigenous women, Two-Spirit, or gender-diverse students. The awards are made possible through generous donation by Helen Bassett, an Ontario artist and passionate advocate for the advancement of Indigenous women, as well as fair solutions to Indigenous land claim issues.

**Eligibility:** Applicants must be currently pursuing post-secondary studies (priority is given to students who are studying law or are in a law-related field); demonstrate financial need; be an Indigenous woman, gender-diverse, or Two-Spirit person under 31 years of age; and demonstrate a commitment to improving the situation of Indigenous women and youth in Canada politically, culturally, economically, or otherwise.

#### 18. THE SCOTT FERGUSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Internal SASS Deadline: June 27

External Deadline: July 15

Amount: \$3,000

**Description:** The Scott Ferguson Memorial Scholarship was established in the memory of our colleague and friend, Scott Ferguson. He passionately devoted his career to bridging the gap between Indigenous communities, government, and industry. A graduate of the University of Alberta, he demonstrated strong leadership qualities and an ability to connect with Indigenous individuals and communities across Canada. The intent of the Scott Ferguson Memorial Scholarship is to provide financial support to an Indigenous student that is pursuing post-secondary education to further their career development and growth. This award is based on reconciliation, leadership qualities, community involvement and financial need.

#### 19. LORETTA SAUNDERS COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Internal SASS Deadline: July 10

External Deadline: July 30

Amount: \$500 - \$2,000

**Description:** Loretta Saunders was an Inuk woman attending Saint Mary's University in Halifax and just months away from completing an honours degree in Criminology when she was brutally murdered in February 2014. Despite the many obstacles she faced in her life, Loretta excelled during her studies, including in her thesis work on three cases of missing and/or murdered Indigenous women in Mi'kma'ki.

**Eligibility:** Indigenous women from Mi'kma'ki, Nunatsiavut, or Atlantic Canada who are attending a post-secondary institution in Canada and who have completed the equivalent of one year of post-secondary education in the previous two years are invited to apply.

#### 20. INDSPIRE — BUILDING BRIGHTER FUTURES (FORMERLY NAAF)

Internal SASS Deadline: July 12

External Deadline: August 1

Amount: Varies

**Description:** Indspire has evolved into the largest non-governmental funding body for First Nations, Inuit, and Métis post-secondary students across Canada. Bursary and scholarship awards are provided to First Nations, Inuit, and Métis students annually across a diverse range of disciplines. There is one application for all of Indspire's bursaries, scholarships, and awards (with a few exceptions that you'll see below). You only need to complete the application once to be considered for all applicable bursaries, scholarships, and awards.

#### 21. NATIONAL UNION'S SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Internal SASS Deadline: Two business weeks prior to submission

External Deadline: August

Amount: \$1,500

**Description:** The National Union of Public and General Employees (NUPGE) offers five scholarships that reflect its pursuit of equal opportunity for all workers.

**Eligibility:** They are open to: the children, grandchildren, or foster children of the National Union's members; who are children, grandchildren, or foster children of a NUPGE member; all students with disabilities who plan to enter the first year of a Canadian public post-secondary education institution full-time; all Indigenous Canadian students who plan to enter the first year of a Canadian public post-secondary institution full time, and who are the children, grandchildren, or foster children of a NUPGE member; or all visible minority students who plan to enter the first year of a Canadian post-secondary education full-time.

#### 22. BERNIE HEARD MEMORIAL BURSARY

Internal SASS Deadline: July 18

External Deadline: August 5

Amount: \$1,000

**Description:** Bernie Heard was an active member of the NunatuKavut Community Council (NCC) who passed away in January of 2008. He served as both the Vice President and Interim President for a period, and is very much missed in Labrador. Bernie was a great musician and especially loved to perform music from his culture. He was also very active in historical and genealogy research and his work contributed greatly to the foundation of our membership systems. In memoriam, NCC is administering a Bernie Heard Memorial Bursary. It is funded through a donation of a member. Preference for the awarding of this bursary may be given to students studying in the areas of Music and History. Other areas of priority consideration may include visual and performing arts, anthropology and archeology.

**Eligibility:** Applicant must be a current member of NCC; Enrolled in full-time studies (generally four courses or more) at a Government-recognized university or college; If applicable, successful completion and passing of the previous semester of post-secondary studies; and maintained at least a 60% cumulative average. Priority consideration is given to students not receiving other forms of funding from NCC.

#### 23. RAYMOND TURNBULL MEMORIAL BURSARY

Internal SASS Deadline: TBA

External Deadline: TBA

Amount: \$2,000

**Description:** Raymond Turnbull grew up in Charlottetown, Labrador. He went on to pursue a degree in education and later taught at the school in Charlottetown. Raymond came to the NunatuKavut Community Council (NCC) as the Education Officer where he dedicated his life to helping Indigenous youth. Sadly, Raymond passed away in 2004, leaving a void in the hearts of his family, friends and colleagues. In his memory and honour, NCC is administering a Raymond Turnbull Memorial Bursary, valued at \$2000.

Margot Duley was born in St. John's and received a BA from Memorial University of Newfoundland, an MA from Duke University and a PhD in history from the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London. She is author of "The Cross-Cultural Study of Women" (1986). The terms of the Duley Award reflect her support of Indigenous people, their traditions and communities.

**Eligibility:** Valued at a portion of the income on the endowment, the award will be granted annually to an Indigenous undergraduate student in any year of study who has graduated from a high school in Labrador. Students can demonstrate their Indigenous heritage through provision of a membership card or demonstrate that they are claimed by their Indigenous community by providing a letter from a leader in their Indigenous community (for example, an elder or local leader). Students must meet the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by Memorial University of Newfoundland. In cases where there are equally deserving candidates, preference will be given to academic achievement. This award will be granted by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Scholarships, Bursaries, and Awards.

It will be awarded by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Scholarships, Bursaries, and Awards.

Students can demonstrate their indigenous heritage through provision of a membership card or demonstrate that they are claimed by their Indigenous community by providing a letter from someone in their Indigenous community. If there are no suitable candidates in a given year, the Award may be given to a Canadian student who is a woman or gender minority (including two-spirit, transgender, and nonbinary persons) and Indigenous, in any year of undergraduate studies and who meets the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by the University. The Award will be renewable for up to four additional years provided the recipient maintains the minimum academic requirements for an award as defined by the University. A new student will be selected when the previous student completes their eligibility. The award will be granted by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Scholarships, Bursaries, and Awards. A special application is required.

The Shannen's Dream Scholarship is made possible by generous donations from the Collure family from Richmond Hill, Ontario, and education technology company Top Hat.

**Eligibility:** The scholarship is open to First Nations youth who meet the following eligibility criteria: Open to First Nations youth 30 years old and under; must be enrolled in a post-secondary program (university, college or trade school) with a duration of no less than 13 weeks. Consideration criteria: 1) the recipient contributes to their First Nations community (urban or rural) and, 2) demonstrates academic or extra-curricular accomplishments at school, such as taking part in clubs or sports teams. "Pay-it-forward" requirement: The recipient agrees to make a fair and measurable contribution to Shannen's Dream or a related First Nations initiative as a condition of the award. The recipient must agree to provide the scholarship committee with details of their contribution within one year of receiving the award. This is a one-time award not renewable to past recipients. Financial need will be considered.
