The School of Arctic and Subarctic Studies at the Labrador Campus of Memorial University invites applications from individuals interested in teaching the following **undergraduate course** in the **Bachelor of Arctic and Subarctic Interdisciplinary Studies (BASIS)** program in the **Fall 2024** semester.

Subject to budgetary restrictions and sufficient enrolments, appointments will be made on a course-by-course basis and will not entail any obligation to conduct research or to perform any administrative service for Memorial University. Appointments will be made in accordance with the provisions in the MUN-LUMUN Collective Agreement. Course design and evaluation methods for all courses will be in accordance with the School of Arctic and Subarctic Studies regulations and the Memorial University Calendar.

Course Title: SASS 1000: Indigenous Peoples, Places, and Cultures of What is Now Called Labrador

Course Schedule: Fall 2024 Module 1 (first six weeks of the Fall semester) (days/times tbd in consultation with successful candidate and the Dean)

Campus Location: Labrador Campus of Memorial University, Happy Valley-Goose Bay, NL

Course Description: SASS 1000: Indigenous Peoples, Places, and Cultures in What is Now Called Labrador explores the diverse histories, cultures, traditions, and stories of the diverse Indigenous Peoples in what is now known as Labrador, who have occupied the lands, waters, and sea ice for millennia. Students will be guided by interdisciplinary and Indigenous forms of knowledge and scholarship to strengthen their understanding of the unique histories, cultures, and places of the Innu and Inuit.

Qualifications: Candidates must have a minimum of a Master's degree with a proven record of instructing at the undergraduate level. Preference will be given to individuals who have taught

courses related to the long-term history of Innu and Inuit, Labrador lands, waters, and Peoples, the North, and/or Indigenous Peoples, who conduct research in Labrador, and who have relationships and connections with Labrador partners.
