# Frecker Program

Study French in Saint-Pierre et Miquelon!





## **About Frecker**

The Frecker Program is a French immersion program held in Saint-Pierre et Miquelon that is jointly organized by MUNL and Le Francoforum. The program gives students the opportunity to take 2000 level MUNL French courses while living in a Francophone milieu.

During their time in Saint-Pierre, students stay with a local family and engage with their host community through experiential learning opportunities organized by Le Francoforum. These may include guided tours of the nearby islands of Miquelon and l'Île-aux-Marins, museum visits, trips to local farms and distilleries, traditional dance workshops, painting, leatherwork, and baking classes etc.

Students are accompanied by a program director who is appointed by the Department of Modern Languages, Literatures and Cultures.

Two programs are offered each year: **Spring** (late May - late June) *1 month* **Fall** (early Sept. - early Dec.) *3 months* 

The application period for Frecker is always during the winter semester immediately before the spring and fall programs for that year.

# **Program cost**

The Frecker Program is subsidized by the Government of Canada and the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Program participants pay the regular MUNL tuition and fees associated with registering for their French courses + a program fee that covers their room and board, transportation costs, textbooks, and cultural excursions.

Spring program fee: \*\$1,500 Fall program fee: \*\$2,000
