Our Goal

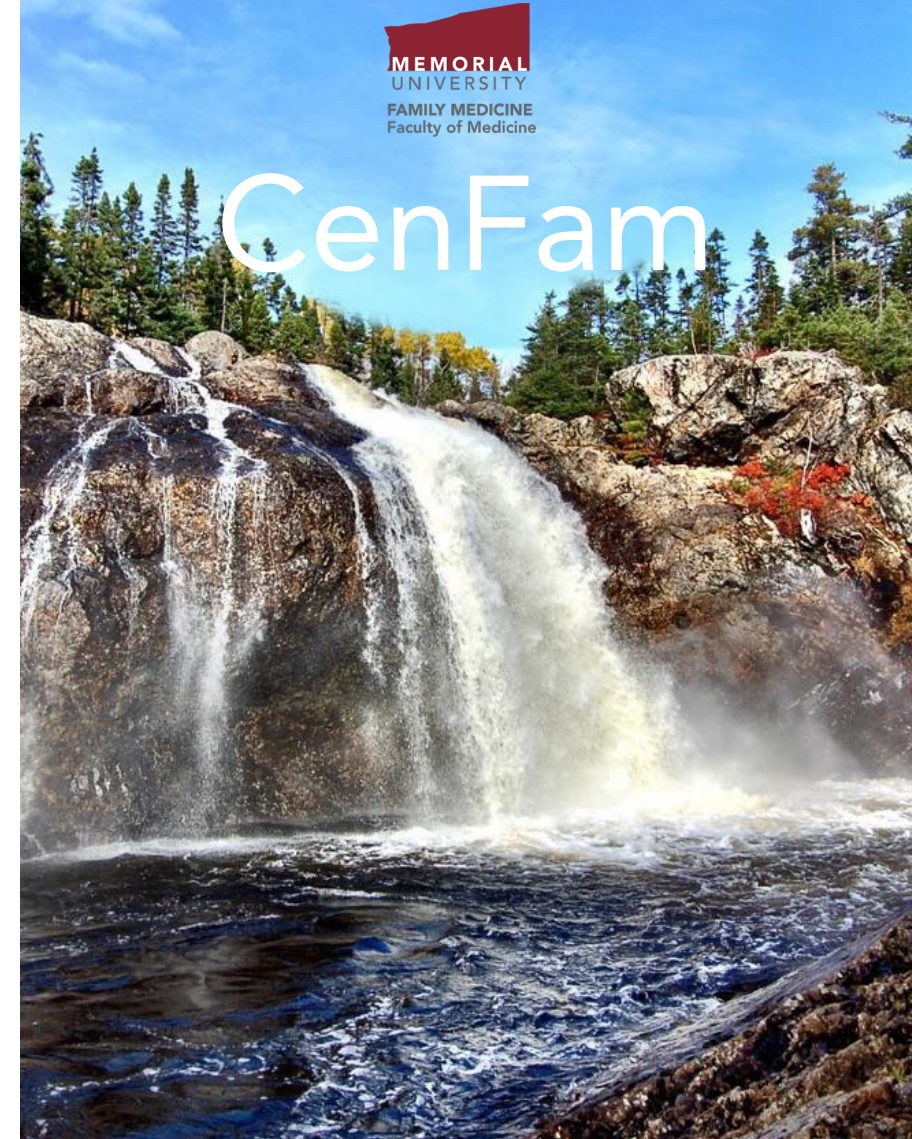

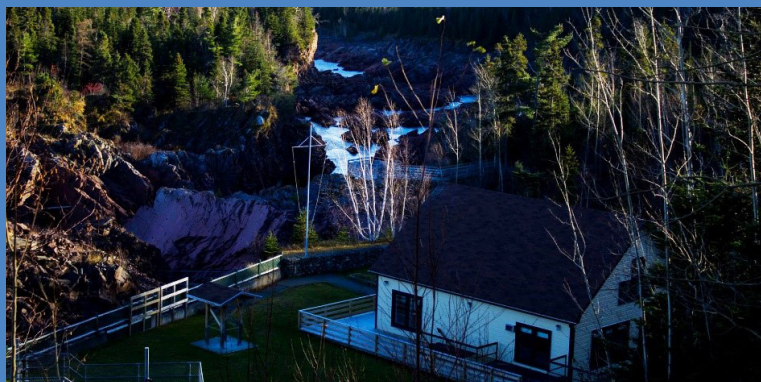

Our Teaching Sites

Twillingate is a beautiful picturesque outpost located on the edge of Iceberg alley. It is fondly known as the "Iceberg Capital of the World". Notre Dame Bay Memorial Health Centre is home to the Twillingate teaching site which, over the years, has trained many great rural family physicians. www.twillingate.com



Botwood, situated at the mouth of the Bay of Exploits, is a quaint port town which served as a Royal Canadian Air Force Sea Plane Base during WW2. It is a well-established teaching site for medical learners and home to The Dr. Hugh Twomey Health Care Centre which provides medical services to the many outpost communities of the region. www.town.botwood.nl.ca

Baie Verte is a community located on the Northeast coast of Newfoundland. It was once a bustling mining community. Gold and copper mining is still the major employer.
