Dean's Updates

Congratulations to:

- The organizers of Monte Carlo 2021. The event raised over \$92,000. This makes 2021 one of the most financially successful years on record for Monte Carlo, despite the challenges of event planning during a global pandemic.
- Dr. Bolu Ogunyemi on being named as a recipient of the 2022 Most Inspiring Immigrants in Atlantic Canada.
- Dr. Jane Barron on being named a CAME Certificate of Merit recipient for 2022.
- Discipline of Family Medicine in working with Iqaluit communities to improve the physician workforce.
 Iqaluit is one of three sites chosen as a model of recruitment and retention of rural family physicians by the National Task Force on Rural Medical Education and Training by the College of Family Physicians of Canada & the Society of Rural Physicians of Canada.
- Scholars at Risk Advocacy Day held virtually on March 31. It was an opportunity to connect with students, faculty and a community of activists to promote academic freedom and human rights. https://www.mun.ca/international/about-us/scholars-at-risk/.
- Professionalism Moment: the Faculty of Medicine has approved a new Mistreatment Policy, which replaces the Respectful Learning Environment for Medical Education Policy. The new policy includes: an expanded scope and definition of mistreatment; provides for the provision of a support person for both complainant and respondent; and refers to the role of the bystander. The policy provides a more informed approach to handling learner mistreatment and includes a new procedure for anonymous disclosure through Memorial's Incident Management System (MIMS). The new procedure can be accessed online and is also available on the MUNSafe app, by clicking 'Support Resources, 'Student Support,' and then 'Faculty of Medicine Learner Well-Being and Success'.
- Canadian Conference on Medical Education (CCME)
 will take place April 23-26 in a hybrid format with

- events being held in Calgary, AB and some activities will be held virtually.
- The outcome from Medical Research Fund (MRF) grant competition (2021-2022) was announced, where four (4) research grants were funded. The successful applicants were: Dr. Sarah Power (Division of Community Health and Humanities), Dr. Deepak Kaushik (Division of BioMedical Sciences), Dr. Zhiwei Gao (Division of Community Health and Humanities), and Dr. Edward Randell (the Cox Award; Discipline of Laboratory Medicine).
- There were two successful applicants for the Dean's Collaborative Clinical and Non-Clinical Research Award, (i) Dr. Laurie Twells (Division of Community Health and Humanities), Dr. David Pace (Discipline of Surgery), and Dr. Mark Borgaonkar (Discipline of Medicine), and (ii) Dr. Diana De Carvalho (Division of Community Health and Humanities), Dr. Deanna Murphy (Discipline of Obstetrics and Gynecology) and Dr. Sean Murphy (Discipline of Obstetrics and Gynecology).
- Two of the successful CIHR Funded Health Research Training Platforms had participation from the Faculty of Medicine. Dr. Roger Chafe (Discipline of Pediatrics) is part of a team for the initiative out of University of Calgary for the Empowering Nextgeneration Researchers in perinatal and Child Health (ENRICH) platform, and Dr. Laurie Twells (Division of Community Health and Humanities) is part of another initiative out of the Université Laval for Training platform in diabetes, obesity and cardiometabolic health.
- Dr. Tabrizchi congratulated all the recipients of these grants from both internal and external funders.
- Dr. Ann Dorward reported that all ten (10) graduate programs are undergoing academic unit planning (AUP) assessments as per Memorial University Senate AUP procedures. It is expected that the Division of BioMedical Sciences Division will be submitting their self-study to the Dean of Medicine by the end of the month. Following this, the next step will involve an external panel review and report.
