2.1 PHASE 1-4 ASSESSMENT U		
Phase 1: P. Pike had no issues	to report.	



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<u>Phase 2</u>: T. Snelgrove reported learners are on break now for community visits and will return next week.

<u>Phase 3</u>: S. Drodge updated on concerns about faculty sharing questions in lectures, and 2 questions were shared over email accidently and have now been removed. K. Zipperlen suggested sending a reminder email to faculty.

<u>Phase 4</u>: N. Duggan reviewed her responses to the Phase 4 assessment reports for Core Experiences, Electives and Clinical Skills IV. No action items identified regarding assessment. Recommendations from EPA assessment working group approved by UGMS so can move forward with implementation.

2.2 STUDENT MATTERS

<u>Phases 1-3</u>: C. Langmead brought forward concerns about the formatives not representative of what they are learning and exams have contained outdated questions. S. Drodge said they are also frustrated by the lack of questions available to use, same for Phase 2.

Phase 3 Theme 8 (Nephrology) exam was stressful due to software issues with Questionmark, some challenge cards weren't able to be saved and learners were getting kicked out of the program frequently. Class performed well, no concerns from learners since.

- Clinical Skills 4 same as last 3 years
- No changes to assessment for Electives or Selectives
