



MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY POSTGRADUATE TRAINEES HOLDING A POSTGRADUATE EDUCATION LICENSE WITH THE COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS OF NEWFOUNDLAND (the “College”)

The College’s Regulations states that a person entered on the Educational Register:

- Can carry out only those duties, and perform only those procedures, that are assigned to the person by, and under the supervision of, a medical practitioner licensed by the College, and only in relation to the postgraduate training program in which the person is enrolled.
- Cannot issue or sign certificates (e.g. death, medical), statements, sick notes, or other documents which the College restricts to persons holding a license.
- Will only practice medicine as required for the purpose of postgraduate training with Memorial University of Newfoundland.
- Cannot charge a fee for medical services.
- Are only to order medications for in-patients, including patients in the emergency department, of the affiliated hospital to which the resident is assigned for clinical training. These medications will only be dispensed by the hospital pharmacy. Trainees will not sign prescriptions which are intended to be dispensed in community pharmacies. This section does not apply if a resident holds a Provisional Postgraduate Prescribing License (see below).

Postgraduate Trainees with a Provisional Postgraduate Prescribing License

- With a Provisional Postgraduate Prescribing License, you are permitted to issue and sign prescriptions. You are authorized not only to order medications for hospital in-patients, but also issue, without a countersignature, prescriptions which may be dispensed in community pharmacies for patients seen in the course of your postgraduate training.
