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
Advocacy In Action

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Competence Corner

You will be hearing about Competence by Design (CBD) a great deal in the upcoming months as we prepare to roll out CBD for Pediatrics in July 2021. Our CBD committee is working hard to make sure we are prepared to make the necessary changes to enhance our residency program, and make it a smooth transition for learners, faculty and staff. This is a mandated change in how we deliver medical education in Canada. Our current system relies on time as a measure of excellence, which I think most would agree is not the best marker. While this system has produced excellent physicians, it is time to update our process of training and not only enhance the way we teach, but focus on our feedback, coaching and assessment. CBD will allow us to do that! CBD will ensure we have a standardized approach to guarantee a national baseline of competence in our trainees across the country. In house, we will more readily pinpoint areas where learners may be struggling and respond to their individual needs. We will have a more standard and consistent way to track progress. Many of you already have some familiarity with EPAs (entrustable professional activities) as Memorial has been using these for assessment of our clerks for the past several years. We will all become much more familiar with EPAs, as well as milestones and other important factors in shifting to CBD. The committee will be sending out information to inform you of the ongoing implementation plan, help familiarize everybody with what CBD is and what our expectations are.
