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Janeway Foundation Awards \$175,000 to researchers working on improving children's health in Newfoundland and Labrador

The Janeway Research Advisory Committee (JRAC) met on August 25th to assess proposals submitted during their annual call for research applications. The call was for projects which work towards improving the health of children across our province. Through the generous support of the Janeway Foundation, the JRAC was able to approve over \$175,000 for new research projects.

Focus on Core EPA #6

Assessing and managing patients with mental health issues

- This EPA focuses on the recognition, assessment, and management of mental health issues.

- Examples include patients with ADHD; anxiety disorder; conversion disorder; early psychosis; eating disorders; mood disorders; obsessive compulsive disorder; oppositional/disruptive and conduct disorders; substance abuse disorders, including tobacco/nicotine products; and suicidal ideation, intent, and attempts.

The Milestones for this EPA include:

- 1. Apply knowledge of normal and abnormal physical, cognitive, emotional, social and behavioural development
- 2. Perform a clinical assessment that addresses all relevant issues
- 3. Use screening tools and validated questionnaires, as applicable
- 4. Synthesize biological, psychological, and social information to determine a diagnosis



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- 5. Develop and implement a management plan that considers all of the patient's health problems and context
- 6. Prescribe first-line psychotropic medicines as applicable
- 7. Develop a plan for ongoing management and follow-up
- 8. Determine the need for and timing of referral to another health care professional
- 9. Facilitate timely access to services and resources in the health and/or social system(s)
- 10. Apply the principles and limits of confidentiality as defined by professional practice standards and the law
- 11. Apply relevant aspects of mental health law and child welfare legislation

Each edition of J-files will be highlighting a different EPA as our residents move through the stages of training.
