
What factors are contributing to "older" HIV infections?



Some factors contributing to "older" HIV infections...

- Anti-retroviral drugs that help PHAs survive
- Viagra, Cialis and other sexual performance drugs
- Easy online access to sexual partners
- HIV and/or safer sex fatigue
- HIV is solved (by one pill/day)
- Age-related body changes: tissue fragility
- Ignorance about HIV risks (& lack of sex ed)
- Doctor/practitioner ignorance about HIV risks
- Misconception that older people are not having sex!

HIV in Canadians 50 & older

HIV test reports among those 50+:


11% in 2002, 15% in 2007, and 18.25% in 2012

In 2007 HIV Infections among Canadians 50+:

- 36% MSM
- 45% heterosexual contact
- 18% IDU




New HIV Infections

Figure 4. Exposure Category of HIV Case Reports Among Older Canadians, by Year




Percentage of HIV+ Canadians over 40 have increased steadily from 1998 to 2008


Biological challenges for a healthy sex life

Missed opportunities


- Testing Medical appointments


